Online Program Format

- Recommended part-time taking 1 course / 7-week session (up to 2 courses/semester, up to 6/year)
- 6 sessions per year:
 - Fall 1 (September)
 - Fall 2 (November)
 - Spring 1 (January)
 - Spring 2 (March)
 - Summer 1 (May)
 - Summer 2 (July)

- Courses are asynchronous
- Live Classroom each week
- 15:1 student/facilitator ratio
- Online lectures, videos, interactive animations & simulations, discussion boards, electronic portfolios, web conferencing, etc.

MS in CIS Security Concentration

- 10 courses/40 credits
- Can be completed online or on campus
- Anywhere from 0-1 prerequisite courses

- Ideal for students making a career change or pivot
- Designed for students looking to combine technical and managerial competency
- Program provides in-depth knowledge of emerging security threats and solutions to prepare technical leaders to identify, develop, and implement highly secure systems and networks

MS in CS Security Concentration

- 10 courses/40 credits
- Can only be completed on campus
- Anywhere from 0-4 prerequisite courses

- Intended for IT professionals and those interested in moving into CS field
- Prior experience in programming, discrete mathematics, or computer systems helpful but not required
- Students focus on computer language theory, software design, algorithms, operating systems, and data management/analytics

Information Security Graduate Certificate

- 4 courses/16 credits
- Can be completed both online or on campus
- Anywhere from 0-2 prerequisite courses

- Designed for IT professionals and those interested in moving into the security field
- Program will explore topics related to IT security policies and system security
- Students will learn about digital forensics to help in investigating a security breach, or obtain good understanding of how information is stored and how to protect it

Digital Forensics Graduate Certificate

- 4 courses/16 credits
- Can be completed both online or on campus
- Anywhere from 0-1 prerequisite courses

- Provides students comprehensive "digital crime scene investigation" knowledge
- Introduces students to forensic analysis policy and procedures for small and large business operations
- Students will demonstrate solid knowledge of forensic analysis tools, data recovery, and investigation amongst other topics



Graduate Admission Process

- Rolling admission. Decision within 1-3 wks
- Recommend applying at least 1 month before start term

(2-3 months for international students)

Transcripts from all colleges and universities attended*

*Transcripts must be in English. Unofficial & in-progress transcripts are acceptable for the admissions review process. Official transcripts are required upon enrollment.

Professional Portfolio

- Current Resume
- Personal Statement
- Three letters of recommendation**

Test Scores

- NO GRE/GMAT required (optional to submit)
- TOEFL, IELTS, or Duolingo requirement for international students***

^{**}It is required that one letter of recommendation be an <u>academic</u> reference if you graduated or engaged in post-graduate education in the past three years.

^{***}Students who have earned or will have completed at least 2 years of a bachelor's or master's degree at an institution in which the language of instruction was English are eligible for an automatic waiver

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
