- Practical career-focused coursework with research-based faculty & industry professionals teaching ALL course modalities
- Flexible curriculum & pace of program completion (not a cohort/lock-step model)
- Online, On-campus, and hybrid ability to interchange
- Various enrollment options
 - Master of Science (MS) degrees (8-10 courses)
 - Graduate Certificates (4 courses)
 - Non-degree course enrollment (up to 2 can be used towards a grad program)
- Part-time enrollment available (with <u>part-time tuition rates</u>)

- 20 years of dedicated <u>Online Education</u>
- Asynchronous Online coursework with optional LIVE sessions,
 SIX 7-week accelerated terms each calendar year
- Evening on-campus courses that meet once per week (14-week semesters Fall/Spring)
- Robust Summer session course offerings (optional) in both Summer 1 (May-June) and Summer 2 (July-Aug)
- "Complete at your own pace," but all master's programs can be completed in less than 2 years as a part-time student

 - MET CJ 591 Applied Analytical Methods
- Remaining 4 courses made up of:
 - 4 Electives **or** a specific concentration:
 - Crime Analysis
 - Cybercrime Investigation & Cybersecurity
 - Strategic Management



Crime Analysis

• Develop your abilities to use and analyze a variety of data sources to inform the investigations, strategies, and policy decisions of criminal justice organizations.

4 core courses + 4 concentration courses

- Required:
 - CJ 612 Crime and Intelligence Analysis
 - UA 654 GIS and Spatial Analysis
- +2 of the following:
 - CS 521 Information Structures with Python
 - CS 526 Data Structures and Algorithms
 - CS 555 Data Analysis and Visualization with R
 - CS 677 Data Science with Python
 - CJ 640 CJ Management and Accountability Analysis
 - CJ 840 Applied Project in Crime Analysis

Cybercrime Investigation & Cybersecurity

 Students will gain insight into cybercriminology and the practical digital investigative knowledge, legal practices, and policies related to cybersecurity risk assessment.

- 4 core courses + 4 concentration courses
 - Required:
 - CJ 610 Cybercrime
 - CS 693 Digital Forensics and Investigations
 - CJ 710 Applied Digital Forensic Investigation
 - +1 of the following:
 - CS 684 IT Security Policies and Procedures
 - CS 694 Mobile Forensics & Security

Strategic Management

 Develop valuable skills that enhance the ability to analyze diverse problems and build sound, sustainable policies that are guided by logic and planning.

- 4 core courses + 4 concentration courses
 - Required:
 - AD 612 COO-Public Emergency Management
 - CJ 711 Criminal Justice Policy and Planning
 - +2 electives



Non-concentration track

- 4 core courses + 4 electives
- Choose from courses such as:
 - Rehabilitation & Reintegration
 - History of Criminal Justice
 - Cybercrime
 - Youth Crime Problems
 - Terrorism
 - Forensic Criminal Investigation
 - Gender & Justice
 - Crime and Punishment

- Applied Digital Forensic
 Investigation
- Trauma and Crisis Intervention
- Forensic Behavior Analysis
- Policing in a Democratic Society
- Seminar in the Law & Criminal Procedure
- Criminal Justice Administration
- Options for directed study and/or a Masters thesis

Master's Degree vs. Graduate Certificate

- Four course Graduate Certificates are generally meant for students who are looking to improve their knowledge within a specific area.
- Master's Degree programs lead to a solid advanced understanding of the discipline and then can choose to focus their study in one specific area by declaring a concentration.
- BU MET's CJ department offers four Graduate Certificates:
 - Criminal Justice
 - Crime Analysis
 - Cybercrime Investigation & Cyber Security
 - Strategic Management
- Students may take a Graduate Certificate in conjunction with a related master's degree program or start in a Graduate Certificate before "rolling up" into the related Master's program.

 - All College Transcripts (can submit unofficial for application)
 - 2 Letters of Recommendation
 - Personal Statement & Resume
 - English Proficiency Exams for International Students
 - GRE/GMAT not required
