#### **Certificate Requirements**

- Successfully complete at least 16 credits of coursework through classes primarily focused on Africa/Asia, with a grade of B or better in each course.
- Include classes from at least two departments or schools.
- Complete either the capstone MA Paper or two substantial research papers in graduate-level seminars on African/Asian topics.
- Demonstrate reading knowledge of: an African language or a European language used in African studies/an Asian language relevant to the course of study.
