CALL FOR PAPERS

The Pardee Periodical, a student run, faculty advised graduate academic journal at the Boston University Pardee School of Global Studies, is pleased to announce its second print edition.

The Editorial Board invites current graduate students [MA and PhD] to submit original, thought-provoking papers from any discipline relevant to the field of Global Studies. Papers submitted within a year of the author's graduation from an MA program are also eligible.

DEADLINE: October 15, 2016

RESPONSE TIME: 1-2 months from deadline.

STYLE: Papers should be academic in quality, research or policy based, and adhere to Chicago Manual of Style (CMS) conventions. Papers should be double spaced and written in Times New Roman 12-point font with one inch margins and should only use footnotes, not endnotes.

LENGTH: Papers should be no more than 8000 words, including footnotes and bibliography.

SUBMISSION: Papers should be submitted as a Microsoft Word document (.doc or .docx) to pardeegradjournal@gmail.com with the following subject line: "[Submission Title], [Author's Name]." Please include in the body of the email the author's name, academic institution and program, date of graduation, contact information, paper title, and a 250-word abstract.

SELECTION PROCESS: All papers will be subjected to a blind review for content and factual accuracy. Additionally, all papers selected for publication will be subject to editorial modification.
