

CALL FOR PAPERS - SPRING 2017 EDITION

The Pardee Periodical Journal of Global Affairs is now accepting paper submissions for the spring 2017 print issue. The Editorial Board seeks original, thought-provoking reserach and policy papers, written for either a class or an independent project from across the disciplines relevant to the field of global affairs.

Authors must be MA or PhD candidates; recent graduates may submit papers within the same year of their graduation.

Deadline:	February 7 th 2017
Response time:	1-2 months from deadline
Selection process:	All papers will be subject to a blind review process. Accepted papers are subject to editorial modifcation.

Submission Requirements:

- Title page with the paper's title, a max-250 word abstract, a max 100-word author bio, a full word count, the degree the author is currently pursuing, and e-mail contact information.
- Maximum length of 8000 words, including citations, bibliography, and abstract.
- Submissions must conform to Chicago Manual of Style conventions, including footnotes and a bibliography.
- 🐴 Manuscripts must be in Times New Roman, double-spaced, with 1-inch margins.
- Manuscripts should be submitted as a Microsoft word document (.doc or .docx) to pardeegradjournal@gmail.com with the following subject line: "[Author Last Name, First Name], [Submission Title]".
