Both positions implied a high level of autonomy, the need for leadership quality and a high level of responsibility for delivered results.

The OSCE was the first international organization that Montenegro joined after independence. As the inaugural Ambassador, I negotiated mandate of the OSCE Mission to Montenegro which was established in July 2006. I was in charge of setting up and organizing a diplomatic office in Vienna after the country regained independence.
