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


WHAT IS FY101?



Abstract

The CAS Office of Student Programs and Leadership would like to:

- Compare the college adjustment of FY101 students and non-FY101 students
- Assess overall engagement and compare with peer institutions
- Collect information about study habits, extracurricular involvement, social commitments, etc. and compare across a variety of variables

We found that there was a difference in first-year adjustment across populations and along a number of dimensions. Most notable differences were found among first-year males.



Methods

We have selected the Your First College Year (YFCY) Survey, offered by the Higher Education Research Institute (HERI). The YFCY survey has been offered since 2000, and has been adopted by institutions across the country with renowned First Year Experience programs. The YFCY survey specifically assesses the academic and personal development of students during their first year of college.

469 first-year CAS students took the survey (104 male, 365 female)
259 students did not take FY101 (65 male, 194 female)
210 students took FY101 (39 male, 171 female)

Survey was given in Spring of 2017 and assessed the incoming Class of 2020

Limitations

- FY101 is self selecting
- Correlation does not equal causation
- YFCY instrument subjectivity



Implications for Further Research

- Compare results to NSSE
- Statistical significance (working with IR)
- Follow up with qualitative assessment
 - Example: campus involvement, advising
