SUBJECT: Formation of Working Group on Gender-based Harassment Prevention

I write to announce the formation of a working group of faculty and university leaders from across the Charles River and Medical Campuses, tasked with developing a set of recommendations for how BU can advance its efforts to provide a working and learning environment that is free of gender-based harassment.

The recent National Academies <u>report</u> on *Sexual Harassment of Women: Climate, Culture, and Consequences in Academic Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine* provides a disturbing account of the scope of gender harassment in these fields. According to the National Academies, academic environments have the second-highest rate of sexual harassment (58%) when compared to the military (69%), the private sector, and the government. Since the report's release, several federal science agencies have announced their intention to create policies to address gender harassment perpetrated by grantees. In addition, the National Academies is forming an "Action Collaborative" that will bring together a group of like-minded universities to work collectively on the issue.

The Working Group on Gender-based Harassment Prevention will be charged with identifying best practices in preventing gender-based harassment, understanding the efforts underway by the National Academies and other national groups, and developing a set of recommended action steps to cultivate a culture and climate across all disciplines at BU that rejects gender-based harassment. The Working Group is expected to deliver its recommendations to me by September 30, 2019.

As one of the first universities in the United States to open all its divisions to female students, the first coeducational medical college in the world, and the first American university to award a PhD to a woman, BU has a historic commitment to providing a welcoming and respectful setting for students, faculty, and staff of all genders. It is a commitment etched into our narrative and an essential part of BU's continuing effort to attract the very best faculty and students to our campuses.

I want to thank, in advance, the members of the Working Group for their time, thoughtfulness, and energy advancing this important initiative and to give special acknowledgement to Vice

President for Federal Relations Jennifer Grodsky, who has agreed to serve as Chair. I look forward to receiving the group's recommendations early in the fall semester and to sharing next steps with the University community in the months ahead.
