HONORS IN PSYCHOLOGY

Honors in Psychology is an opportunity for senior psychology majors to undertake a yearlong research project for psychology course credit (PS401/402). Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and are not eligible to apply if they have more than one incomplete ("I") grade on their transcript. All students who wish to participate in the Honors in Psychology program must find a *psychology faculty member, to serve as the primary advisor and must conduct research in the faculty mentor's lab within the Department of Psychological & Brain Sciences (PBS). Students will not be allowed to conduct research outside of the Department for Honors in Psychology. A list of faculty who are interested in supervising Honors in Psychology projects and additional information about Honors in Psychology is posted on the Department of Psychological & Brain Sciences web site at www.bu.edu/psych/undergraduate/honors. Honors students are required to complete a thesis and present their research findings to a committee of three members of the Department of Psychological & Brain Sciences & Brain Sciences. The committee will consider both the thesis and the oral examination when determining the student's grade. A grade of B+ or higher in each semester is required to graduate with distinction.

Please note that the Honors project is designed for seniors to work on a two-semester independent study while on campus during their final two semesters. Both the faculty advisor and the student have to be on campus while working on the project.

*This includes faculty members who have primary appointments in the Department of Psychological & Brain Sciences (PBS) or joint appointed faculty who have appointments in PBS and another department at Boston University. The research must be conducted in the faculty member's lab.

Application Instructions

You must complete the attached application in consultation with your project advisor. Please include the following materials with your application:

- Provide a brief description of your intended project. Outline the significance of the proposed work, the method of investigation that will be employed, and the ways the result of the investigation will be analyzed.
- Include a bibliography of readings that are relevant to your work.
- Explain how this project fits in with your academic and career goals.
- Attach an unofficial copy of your BU transcript.

Your project advisor must complete the student evaluation section and both you and your project advisor need to sign the application. You must then submit the application to the department's main office (Room 149) for review by Dr. Joanne Hebden Palfai, Director of Undergraduate Studies, and Dr. David Somers, Chairman. You will be notified via e-mail once the review process has been completed. If your application is approved, the course will be added to your schedule.

The deadline to submit the application for Honors in Psychology is May 31st.

If you find it necessary to request an extension, please contact Dr. Joanne Hebden Palfai, Director of Undergraduate Studies, before the deadline.
