FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS ENTERING AY 25/26 AND AFTER

1. PS 101 or a score of 4 or 5 on the AP Psychology Exam. _____
2. Design and Statistics Requirement _____
(PS 211 (Exp Dsgn), PS/NE 212 (Intro to Matlab) or MA 115 and MA 116 (Stats I & Stats II).
PS 211 and PS/NE 212 do not count toward principal psychology courses)
3. Nine Principal Psychology Courses:
PS 231: Physiological Psychology. _____
Please note:
 - NE 101 (Introduction to Neuroscience) will count in place of PS 231 (Physiological Psychology) if a student took NE 101 prior to declaring their psychology major, or was a previous neuroscience major who switched to psychology, or is a current neuroscience/psychology double major.
 - All students who are psychology majors, and do not fall into one of the categories above, need to take PS231.
 - Students **will not** be awarded credit for both courses. Students may receive credit for PS 231 or NE 101, but not both.

Eight Additional Principal Courses (Four or more must be selected from the 300 level or above)

The choice of principal courses must include at least two courses from each of the broad content groups listed below.

1. Philosophical, Aesthetic, and Historical Interpretation (1 requirement in any area)

- Philosophical Inquiry and Life's Meanings (e.g. CC 202, PH 150, PH 266, RN 100, SED ED 110)
- Aesthetic Exploration (e.g. AH 220, AH 325, CC101, EN 121, EN 130, EN 170, EN 221, EN 379, CFA AR 121)
- Historical Consciousness (e.g. AH 325, CC 211, CI 387, HI 190, LX 205, **PS251**)

2. Scientific and Social Inquiry (2 requirements; 1 requirement in Social Inquiry I or II, 1 requirement in Scientific Inquiry I or II)

- Social Inquiry I (e.g. CC 112, LX 110, **PS 101, PS 231, PS 234, PS 241, PS251, PS261**)
- Scientific Inquiry I (e.g. AS 100, BI 107, CC 111, **PS 222, PS 231, PS 234**)
- Social or Scientific Inquiry II (e.g. BI 108, CC 211, CC 212, **PS 211**, NE 102, SO 306)

3. Quantitative Reasoning (1 requirement in Quantitative Reasoning II)

- Quantitative Reasoning II (e.g. BI 108, CC 212, CS 101, CS 103, CS 111, MA 115, **MA 116**)

4. Diversity, Civic Engagement, and Global Citizenship (1 requirement in any area)

- The Individual in Community (e.g. HI 190, [all 1st-4th semester language courses L-111, L-112, L-211, L-212], LX 110, **PS 261**, SO 306, WS 200, CFA AR 121, CFA AR 369, SED ED 110)
- Global Citizenship and Intercultural Literacy (e.g. AH 220, CC101, CC 112, CI 387, EN 121, LX 205, L- 212 [All 4th semester language courses], RN 100, CFA AR 369)
- Ethical Reasoning (e.g. CC 202, EN 130, NE 102, PH 150, **PS 101**)

5. Communication (*1 requirement, in either Writing, Research & Inquiry, or Writing Intensive)

- Writing, Research & Inquiry (e.g. CC 201, WR 151, WR 152)
- Writing Intensive (e.g. CC 202, CC 211, CI 387, EN 221, EN 379, NE 102, PH 266, **PS 324, PS 325, PS 326, PS 329**, COM CO 201)

***Please note:** To complete your Communication Hub area, you must fulfill either Writing, Research, and Inquiry or Writing-Intensive Course. **Both of these capacities require CAS WR 120 (or equivalent) as a prerequisite.** Thus, unless you bring in an external course that is equivalent to WR 120 (ex. WR 13TR or WR 16TR), you will need to take CAS WR 120 (or an equivalent, such as CAS EN 120 or CAS CC 101) prior to fulfilling the Communication Hub area.

6. Intellectual Toolkit (4 requirements, 1 requirement in each area)

- Critical Thinking (e.g. BI 107, BI 108, CC 112, CC 212, CS 111, PH 150, PH 266, **PS 101, PS 212, PS 222, PS 231, PS 234, PS 241, PS251, PS261**)
- Research and Information Literacy (e.g. AH 220, BI 107, CC 201, EN 121, LX 110, **PS 324, PS 325, PS 326, PS 329**, WR 151, WR 152, COM CO 201)
- Teamwork/Collaboration (e.g. AH 325, AS 100, BI 108, CC 111, HI 190, LX 205, NE 102, **PS 324, PS 325, PS 326, PS 329**, SO 306)
- Creativity/Innovation (e.g. CC 101, CS 111, EN 170, RN 100, CFA AR 121, CFA AR 369)

CAS Language Requirement

- Students must complete through the fourth-level of the same language.

CAS Natural Science Requirement

- Students must complete a course in the Natural Sciences with a lab component as designated by CAS.
