### Visitor Job Risk Assessment/Visitor Medical Clearance Requirements



## **Medical Clearance Guidelines and Educational Reminders for Visitors**

#### Prior to visit:

- If visiting the NEIDL and a medical clearance is required\* a Visitor Job Risk Assessment must be completed by the Sponsor, EHS or Biosafety officer & submitted to ROHP@bu.edu.
- 2. COVID and Seasonal Influenza vaccination are strongly encouraged.
- 3. Be free of signs and symptoms of illness

### No medical clearance required for:

Escorted visitors observing from outside a non-human primate room or inside an animal area where there are no non-human primates

Escorted visitors who enter a non-human primate area wearing full personal protective equipment (PPE) for a brief period of observation only

#### \*Medical clearance required for:

- 1. Escorted visitors entering a room housing non-human primates for an extended duration and/or handling animals or equipment: must provide the following documentation for verification by Animal Science Center or ROHP prior to room entry:
  - a. TB screening documentation with a skin test or blood test showing no tuberculosis exposure in the past 12 months. If a history of a positive TB test, please submit a copy of the positive test, chest xray report, and complete a <u>TB symptom screen form</u>
  - Measles immunity documentation of either a positive measles antibody titer or evidence of two measles or two measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccinations
  - c. COVID and seasonal Influenza vaccination is strongly encouraged

#### 2. Escorted visitors entering Mycobacterium tuberculosis laboratory:

a. TB screening documentation with a skin test or blood test showing no tuberculosis exposure in the past 12 months. If a history of a positive TB test, please submit a copy of the positive test, chest x-ray report, and complete a TB symptom screen form.

# 3. \*ADDITIONALLY, if entering BSL 3 or 4, the following is required:

- 1. Letter from host Institution/Employer/Physician within the past year stating they are medically cleared to enter a BSL3 and/or BSL4 laboratory and are medically cleared to wear a respirator.
  - a. If entering BSL3: letter must state medical clearance for use of a Powered Air-Purifying Respirator (PAPR)
  - b. If entering BSL4: letter must state medical clearance for use of a positive pressure supplied air suit in a negative pressure room
