Boston University Institutional Animal Care and Use (IACUC) Obligation to Report and "Whistleblower" Protection

Boston University (BU) is committed to observing Federal policies and regulations and the Association of Assessment and Accreditation of Laboratory Animal Care (AAALAC) International standards for the humane care and use of animals.

Obligation to Report: All persons involved with the use of animals in research, teaching, training, breeding, and related activities, must know how to report potential violations to animal care and use regulations or concerns with animal care and treatment. Animal welfare concerns may be reported in writing, by telephone, or in person. All of the information obtained from individual reporting, as well as the information obtained during the investigation, will be maintained confidential to the extent possible. Concerns for both campuses may be submitted through any of the mechanisms listed below:

"Whistleblower" Protection: There are no restrictions on who may report a concern or violation. Boston University does not tolerate retaliation toward, or harassment of, employees or students who report actual or potential violations. Investigations will be conducted discreetly, with all reasonable precautions, consistent with the need for a complete and comprehensive review of the report. Confidentiality will be maintained to the extent permissible under federal and state laws and reasonable efforts will be taken to protect the positions, reputations, rights and legitimate interests of both the person reporting the alleged violation and the subject(s) of the investigation.
