Your assistance with the documentation below helps us to provide you with the highest quality care. In order to ensure the health of the entire student community, we **require** that you take the following health-related actions by **August 1, 2016**.

Start by [visiting our student health website](http://www.bu.edu/shs/resources/ihr/) [http://www.bu.edu/shs/resources/ihr/] and completing all sections on the link titled "Graduate or Transfer Student." All required forms are available on this website. The instructions below detail the steps that you must complete.

1. Report your Immunization History. Massachusetts requires a series of immunizations for university students enrolled in the state. You will be unable to register for classes if you do not submit the medical provider-signed Immunization & Physical Form (downloaded from the instructions link noted above).
2. Enter your required health history.
3. Students who will be under 18 years of age on September 1, 2016, must complete the Consents & Acknowledgements Form.
4. All intercollegiate or club student athletes must complete the Athletic Screening Questionnaire. This must be completed in addition to the health history noted above.
5. Upload or mail the completed paper forms to Student Health Services at the fax number or address below. Please do not contact SHS to check if we have received your information. Please allow a minimum of 10 business days for your information to be processed. Follow these steps to check your immunization status:
  - a) Check your Student Link: <http://www.bu.edu/students/academics/link/>
  - b) Click on **PERSONAL**
  - c) Click on **COMPLIANCE STATUS**
  - d) Then check your **MEDICAL IMMUNIZATION STATUS**.
