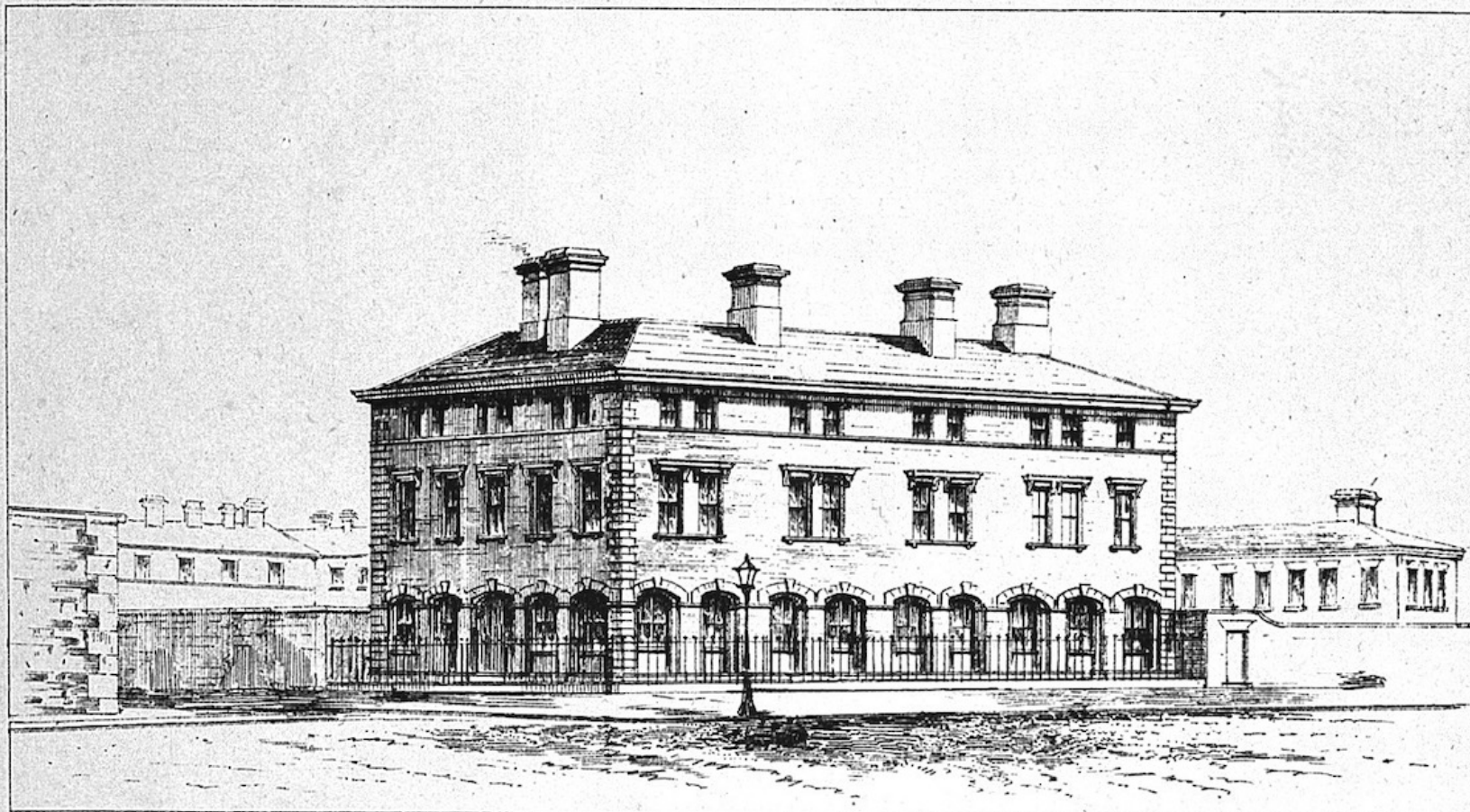

A typical Liverpool slum court, c.1905.



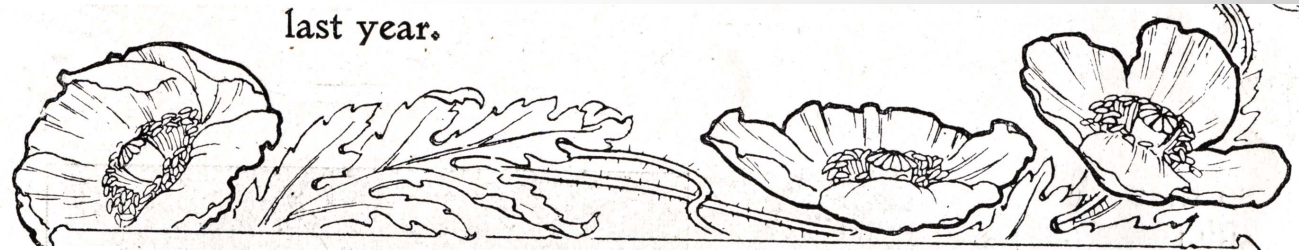

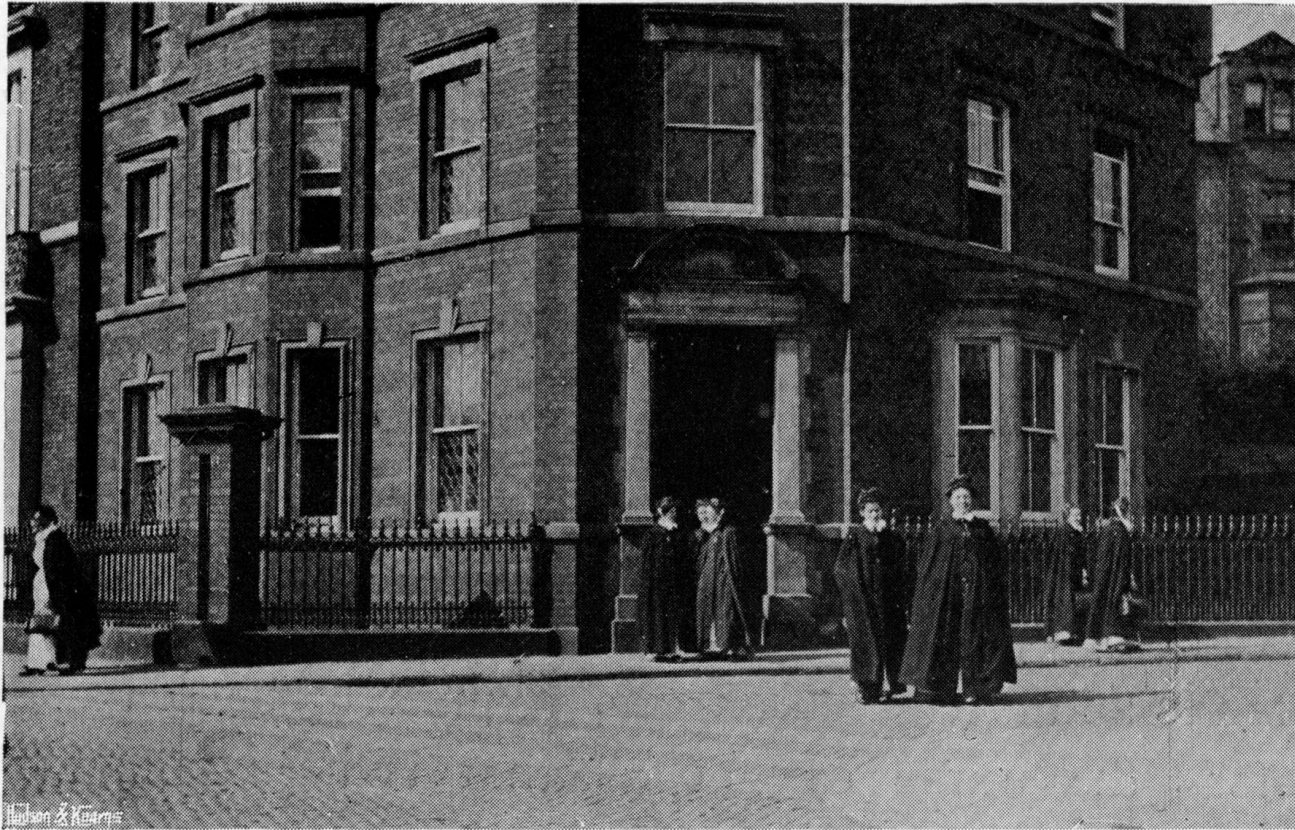
