Draft policy briefs on a state's health care quality measurement activities. Conduct extensive literature reviews and interview stakeholders including legislators, state government officials (regulators/analysts, executive agencies, core service agencies), academics and policy experts, providers / health systems, insurance executives, and advocacy organizations to inform conclusions and policy recommendations. Write white paper discussing the current policy debate, the ways in which integration can be achieved, and policy recommendations. Analyze current and proposed health policies based on cost, access, quality, and equity; attend legislative debate and hearings regarding relevant legislation and topic areas. Track bills pending before the Legislature and develop succinct and focused bill comments and position statements. Facilitate policy discussions amongst programs, bureaus and senior staff; and develop deliverables such as Excel database to track legislative reports, policy brief, and legislative reports. Analyze data such as those used to identify disparities or access issues to inform policy decisions.

Work with federal and state officials on ongoing administration, amendment, and expansion processes related to the State Plan, Waivers, Demonstrations, Medicare, federal grants, federal contracts, and other federal partnership opportunities. Play key role in ensuring overall effectiveness in generating and accelerating positive changes in health, working cross-functionally to design, implement and communicate Health Policy projects. Perform secondary research and analysis, design and execute studies to identify and describe health-related issues, and partner with funders and governmental entities in an objective and comprehensive manner. Work independently to conduct quantitative analyses assessing utilization, spending, and out-of-pocket costs of sexual and reproductive health services, including defining analytic approaches, debugging and running code to carry out analyses, and writing up descriptions of methodologies and results.
