

# E&I Student Gatherings

This year BUSSW's Equity and Inclusion student research team hosted about 20 student gatherings for students to inspire mutual aid by discussing strategies and providing advice for how to navigate resources. These gatherings also provided a safe space for students to share testimonies and receive encouragement about challenges they face.

Students were able to meet with the administration in the student support services team, the alumni and career services office, the chair of clinical practice program, and the financial aid office.

Students also created red cards and pasted know your rights flyers around public spaces at BUSSW to educate people on ways to thwart ICE's attempts at displacing immigrants and refugees.

Total # of Attendees/Participants: 25+ students over the course of these 20 gatherings

## E&I Student Affinity Groups

BUSSW Student Services Support Team offered two student affinity groups this academic year. The goal of these groups was to create a supportive space for students to share their experiences with peers who held similar identities. Facilitated by staff, the groups were specifically designed for BU students who identified as first-generation and for those who identified as LGBTQIA+.

These events were hosted once a month beginning in February of 2025. The program hopes to work with students to identify future activities and programing for next year.

## Licensing Preparation & Accessibility Initiative

307 students from all platforms participated in the initiative

15 events were hosted by BUSSW staff between March and November

99 students attended discounted NASW prep courses and 13 students received scholarships to attend

21 students were reimbursed for state licensing application fees and 92% passed the exam on the first try



# Concerned Jewish Faculty and Staff

Jewish Faculty and Staff concerned about the weaponization of antisemitism to attack immigrant students, research funding and academic freedom have organized a group at BU as well as the greater Boston area. The BU group includes a wide swath of people who share the common concern about the way antisemitism is being used to control the university. Group members acknowledge that antisemitism has at times been an issue at BU, but they are in agreement that BU is a good and safe place to be publicly Jewish.

To move forward its agenda, Concerned Jewish Faculty and Staff-BU has met with President Gilliam twice to offer our shared perspective, participated in sending a letter to the trustees, and joined with faculty and staff from other Boston area colleges and universities to host a <u>Freedom Seder</u>, based on the original one held in 1969.
