Introduction:

Thank you for agreeing to serve as a supervisor for a Boston University School of Theology student undertaking their Contextual Education placement during this school year! Because of this, you are part of this year's Supervisor Cohort, an auspicious group of pastors, non-profit leaders, educators, administrators, and activists doing the work of mentoring students. We in the Contextual Education Office thank you for your willingness to support the theological education of up-and-coming religious leaders in such a direct way. The goal of our Supervisor Gatherings throughout the school year is not to form you into a supervisor. There's no doubt that you have many skills for mentoring already, given your own personal and professional development over the years. So, while there will be some "Supervisor 101" content to make sure we all have shared language and best practices of the BUSTH Contextual Education program, the majority of our time together will be spent exploring content that we hope will help you dig deeper into your own understanding of what it means to be a resource and guide for the next generation of religious leaders. The most excellent supervisors among us are those who are able to read the institutional, personal, and societal contexts around them and help their student(s) do the same.

Supervisor Gatherings Throughout the Year:

All supervisors are encouraged to attend as many Supervisor Gatherings as possible throughout the school year as these provide an opportunity for connecting with one another, troubleshooting any issues, and delving deeper into the practice of mentoring students. Most of the events will be held on Zoom, except for a "Supervisor Orientation" event at the start of the Fall semester and a "Thank You Luncheon" at the end of the Spring semester. Those two events will take place on-campus.

Supervisor Certification:

Supervisors who want to be certified with the BUSTH Contextual Education Office must complete at least 10 hours of training during the school year by attending Supervisor Gatherings. All supervisors who complete 10 hours of training or more will be considered "certified" for future school years. Supervisors who complete 10 hours of training and would like one Continuing Education Unit (CEU) along with their certification should let Leo Roberts (<u>sthope@bu.edu</u>) know by April 1st.
