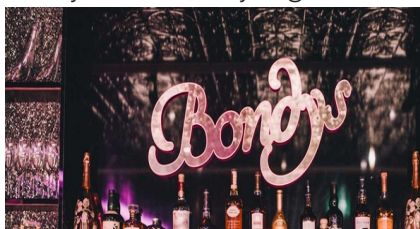
### **Caviar at Bondys**

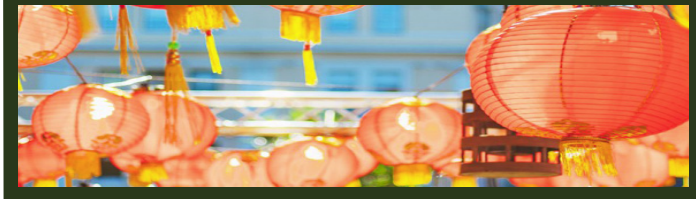
#### **Lunar Streets for Chinese New Year**
