In-Class Activity Online Implementation

- 1. Your instructor will put you in a break-out room with one other student.
- 2. Exchange a draft of your recent paper with your classmate. You can send each other your files via the Zoom chat or you can share the links to your Google docs.
- 3. As you read your partner's draft, pay special attention to the sentence structure and leave feedback for the other student by using the "Comment" function in your word processing software. In particular, mark any issues you see in the draft that relate to the author's:
 - use and types of sentence subjects
 - subject-verb agreement
 - · placement of adjectives and adverbs
 - fragments
- 4. Next, write a one-paragraph letter to your partner, in which you summarize the three biggest concerns you have about their sentence structure. Be specific and give examples of issues you noticed in their writing. You can write your letter immediately below the draft you just read (that is, you can write in your partner's file).
- 5. Finally, share your notes and your letter with your partner by sending the file via the Zoom chat if needed.
