**Possible Answer Sheet/aspects to review with students for In-class Activity  
Option 1 to review with students in class:**

Note that the poster has a 4-column layout with a banner section for the title, name(s), and affiliation of the authors. Each column is then divided into subheadings based on sections. For example, the first subheading could be the abstract. The second subheading could be the introduction, followed by a subheading each for background, research findings, conclusions, and limitations. The last few sections of the poster would usually be the references and the acknowledgments. Note also that there is a good balance of images, graphs, tables, and text on the poster. The poster also makes good use of “white space” i.e., the parts of the poster that are not populated with any information. By using white space effectively, you can avoid making your poster look busy and crowded.
